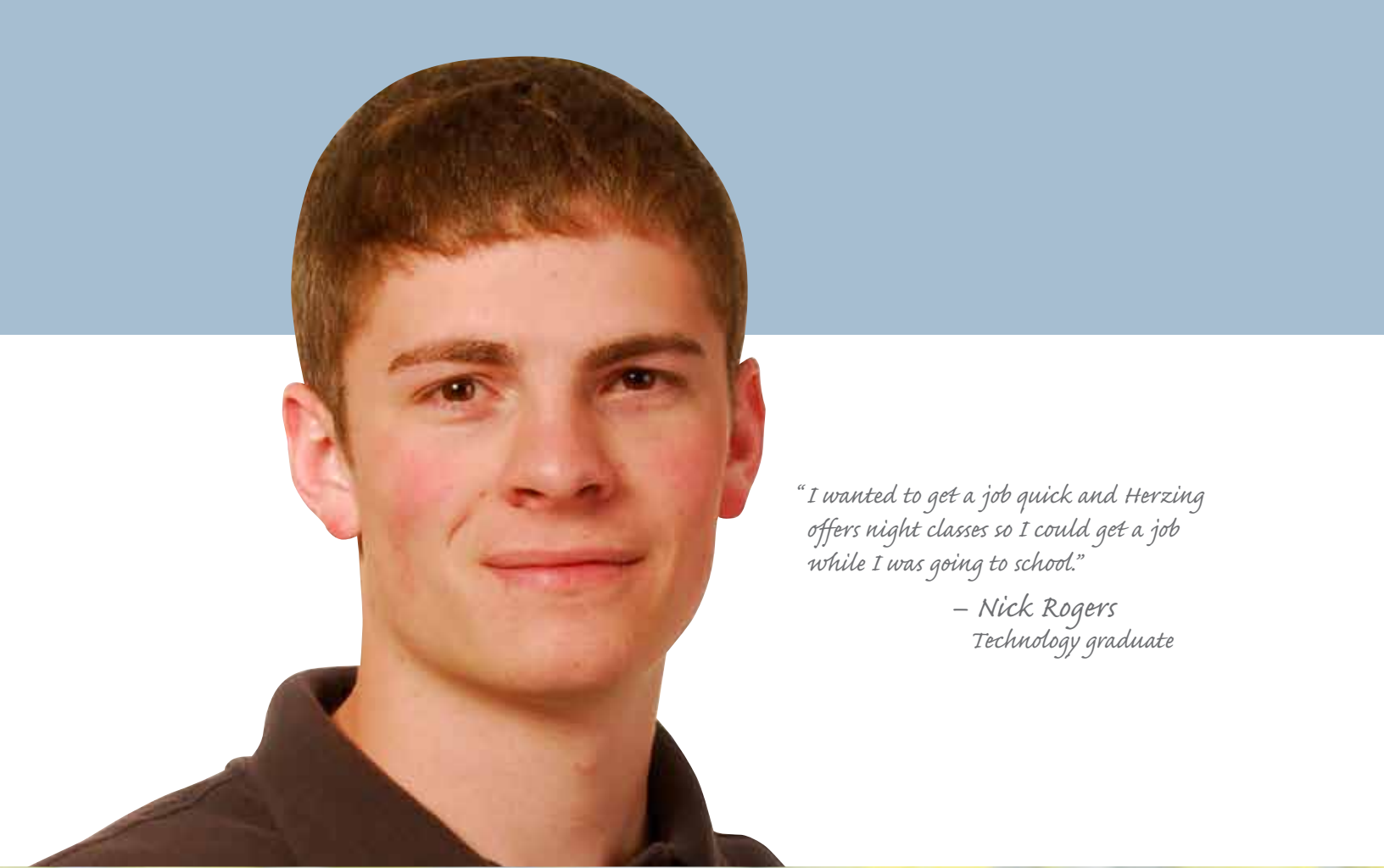

Technology

Computer Programming/ Database Administration

Computer programmers write, test, and maintain the detailed instructions called programs that computers must follow to perform their functions. Programmers are well versed in sophisticated programming and Web development languages that focus on commerce and database applications. These are programs that can be used internally at a company or on the Internet for e-business.

Many companies are migrating to Internet or Web-based programs. Every business today runs on one or more databases for everything from customer information, order entry, and inventory tracking to sales, marketing, and payroll functions. As a programmer, your responsibilities may include Database Administration, a role that involves storing, manipulating, retrieving, and maintaining a database.

Programmers are often grouped into two broad types — applications programmers and systems programmers. Applications

programmers write programs to handle a specific job, such as a program to track inventory, within an organization. They may also revise existing packaged software.

Systems programmers, on the other hand, write programs to maintain and control computer systems software, such as operating systems, networked systems, and database systems. In some organizations programmers, referred to as programmer-analysts, are responsible for both the systems analysis and the actual programming work.

adjust performance of existing networks and continually survey the current computer site to determine future network needs.

Administrators also troubleshoot problems as reported by users and automated network monitoring systems, and make recommendations for enhancements in the construction of future servers and networks. Another very important role of a network administrator is to protect an organization's data and systems from unwanted intruders.

Computer Networking/ Administration/Information Technology Management

Network or computer systems administrators design, install, and support an organization's Local Area Network (LAN), Wide Area Network (WAN), Internet, or intranet system. They provide day-to-day onsite administrative support for software users in a variety of work environments, including professional offices, small businesses, government, and large corporations. They maintain network hardware and software, analyze problems, and monitor the network to ensure availability to system users.

Systems administrators are the information technology employees responsible for the efficient use of networks by organizations. They ensure that the design of an organization's computer site allows all the components, including computers, the network, and software, to fit together and work properly. Furthermore, they monitor and

Financial Services Representative

Financial Services Representatives maintain and grow the client portfolio by identifying and promoting personal banking solutions for clients’ total financial services needs. Working directly with clients, you will be responsible for varied services and products.

Employers in banks, insurance companies, investment firms, and brokerage houses look for the same skill sets. Ideal candidates are people looking for a secure financial

future that will make use of their people skills, knowledge, and desire to make a difference.

Professionals in this field typically enjoy competitive starting salaries, good benefits, stock incentive plans, ongoing training for advancement, and a pleasant work environment.

Business Administration/Management

The success of a business organization is highly dependent on employees working together in a variety of areas, such as accounting, marketing, sales, human resources, and administration. A diploma in Business Administration prepares students for a wide scope of disciplines in business and management. People with this training work in not-for-profit organizations, in government, and in organizations throughout the private sector, including entrepreneurial endeavors. They are proficient in the use of computer software and applications and have a broad understanding of business functions.

Office Automation/ Administrative Assistant

Performing highly diversified tasks, the business office professional must be proficient in computer software and business communications. Office professionals are necessary to the administration of services in various areas of an organization, including finance, accounting, marketing, operations, human resources, customer service, sales, and purchasing. The responsibilities of an administrator may include spreadsheet and report development, bookkeeping, and business administration, as well as playing a major role in the delivery of services to clients.

Accounting and Payroll Administrator

This program provides students with the necessary accounting skills and knowledge for entry-level accounting and payroll positions in both small and large organizations. In small establishments, accounting and payroll administrators handle all financial transactions, recordkeeping and payroll duties which includes everything from recording transactions and producing

financial statements to preparing report summaries for supervisors and managers. In large offices and accounting departments, professionals may have more specialized tasks. They may total, balance, and reconcile billing vouchers; ensure the completeness and accuracy of data on accounts; code documents according to company procedures; or handle employee payroll.

Law Clerk/ Legal Assistant

The Law Clerk and Legal Assistant programs provides an overview of legal principles, practices, and procedures. Areas of study include legal office procedures, English, word processing, legal theory, and the practical application of the law in areas such as Real Estate, Family Law, Corporate Law, Wills & Estates and Litigation. Graduates will be prepared to work in law offices or legal departments of many organizations in several sectors. Graduates are prepared to work in law firms, government offices, private industry and real estate companies.

Paralegal

The Paralegal program provides both theory and practical skills covering all areas where Paralegals are permitted to practice such as small claims court, advocacy, highway traffic, tribunals and landlord and tenant. The Herzing College Toronto Paralegal program is accredited with the Law Society Of Upper Canada which allows graduates to write the Licensing exam to become a licensed Paralegal. Graduates will work in law firms, Government offices, corporate legal departments and many will chose to become self-employed.

Healthcare & Social Services

Pharmacy Technician/Pharmacy Assistant

Pharmacy technicians/assistants play an important role in providing essential healthcare services in their communities. They order and receive medications and pharmaceutical supplies. They utilize specialized software to maintain patient profiles, prescription orders, and inventories. Pharmacy technicians/assistants compound prescribed pharmaceutical products by calculating, measuring, and mixing the quantities of drugs and other ingredients required. They assist pharmacists by ordering, packaging and labeling pharmaceutical products and by maintaining prescription records and inventories of

medication and pharmaceutical products. Working with the registered pharmacist, pharmacy technicians demonstrate tact and excellent judgment to ensure confidentiality of sensitive information.

Upon graduation, Pharmacy technicians/assistants can work in either a community, clinic, or hospital pharmacy. Job opportunities also exist in government health departments, insurance, and pharmaceutical companies. Some common job titles include: pharmacy technician, pharmacy technical assistant, and pharmacy aide.

Clinical Office Assistant/ Medical Office Administrator

These professionals play an important role on the medical office team. They perform routine administrative and clinical tasks to keep the offices and clinics of physicians, podiatrists, chiropractors, and optometrists running smoothly. Their duties vary from office to office, depending on office location, size, and specialty. They answer telephones, greet patients, update and file patient medical records, fill out insurance forms, handle correspondence, schedule appointments, arrange for hospital admission and laboratory services, and handle billing and bookkeeping.

Clinical duties may include taking medical histories and recording vital signs, performing visual acuity tests, performing simple lab tests such as urinalysis, performing electrocardiograms, removing sutures, changing sterile dressings, explaining treatment procedures to patients, preparing patients for examination, and assisting the physician during patient examinations.

Healthcare Aide/Personal Support Worker

Healthcare aides/personal support workers provide critical healthcare services to patients in hospitals, nursing homes, and other healthcare facilities. They assist nurses, hospital staff, and physicians in the basic care of patients. Basic care includes a range of duties covering everything from making beds and maintaining patients' rooms to taking vital signs and operating healthcare equipment. Healthcare Aides/Personal Support Workers can be found working in hospitals, nursing homes, and private residences, as well as other healthcare

facilities. Other job titles can include nurse aide, patient care aide, nursing attendant, and personal care worker.

Medical Laboratory Assistant

Medical laboratory assistants are important members of medical laboratory teams. They are employed in medical laboratories, hospitals, clinics, research institutes, and universities. Medical laboratory assistants are responsible for collecting blood samples and for providing instructions to patients on how to collect samples of various body fluids for specific tests ordered by the doctor. They will label, file, handle, store, and prepare them for testing. Quality of work of the medical laboratory assistant is very important since it affects the accuracy of the test results that in turn determine diagnosis or medical treatment.

Community and Social Services Worker

Careers in community and social services appeal to persons with a strong desire to make life better and easier for others. Workers in this industry usually are good communicators and enjoy interacting with people. Community and social services workers provide many types of assistance to people in the community, from determining eligibility for social assistance and health programs and counseling on child care to helping clients with physical and mental problems and those involved in drug and substance abuse. Herzing College's program includes education in customer service, profiling high risk populations, sociology, and psychology.

Design

3-D Animation

Computer animation is one of the most rapidly expanding areas of design, encompassing technical development and creativity. The expansion of the market and the applications of computer animation are predicted to have an explosive growth for many years to come. This is an exciting, fast-changing, and rewarding area.

This program prepares students with the skills and competencies needed in the game, film and television industries. It includes

storyboarding, character animation, modeling characters and scenes, texturing, special effects, lighting, and an internship. Animation studies begin with a strong foundation in design, drawing, color, 3-D animation, and game production. As they advance, students learn to develop a storyboard, create and animate 3-D models, and develop background layouts and special effects. Students learn to work in production environments and to market themselves and their skills. As part of their coursework, all students develop a demo reel to show prospective employers.

CAD Drafting

Drafters prepare technical drawings and plans used by production and construction workers to build everything from manufactured products—such as toys, toasters, industrial machinery, or spacecraft—to structures, such as houses, office buildings, or oil and gas pipelines. Their drawings provide visual guidelines, showing the technical details of the products and structures and specifying dimensions, materials to be used, and procedures and processes to be followed. Drafters fill in technical details, using drawings, rough sketches, specifications, codes, and calculations previously made by engineers, surveyors, architects, or scientists.

Computer Graphic Design

Graphic designers are visual problem solvers. They enjoy the challenge of working with clients and resource people to produce effective visual communications. Artists create art to communicate ideas, thoughts, or feelings using a variety of methods including both print & Web design. Graphic artists create special effects, animation, or other visual images using film, video, computers, or other electronic media.

Graphic artists can work in a variety of industries, including computer and data processing services, advertising, and the motion picture and television industries. They use computers to create the large series of pictures that form the animated images or special effects seen in movies, television programs, and computer games. Some are involved in the production of television commercials, movies, print, and animation. Graphic designers are challenged to meet tight deadlines and to produce original designs within the parameters of budget and technology.

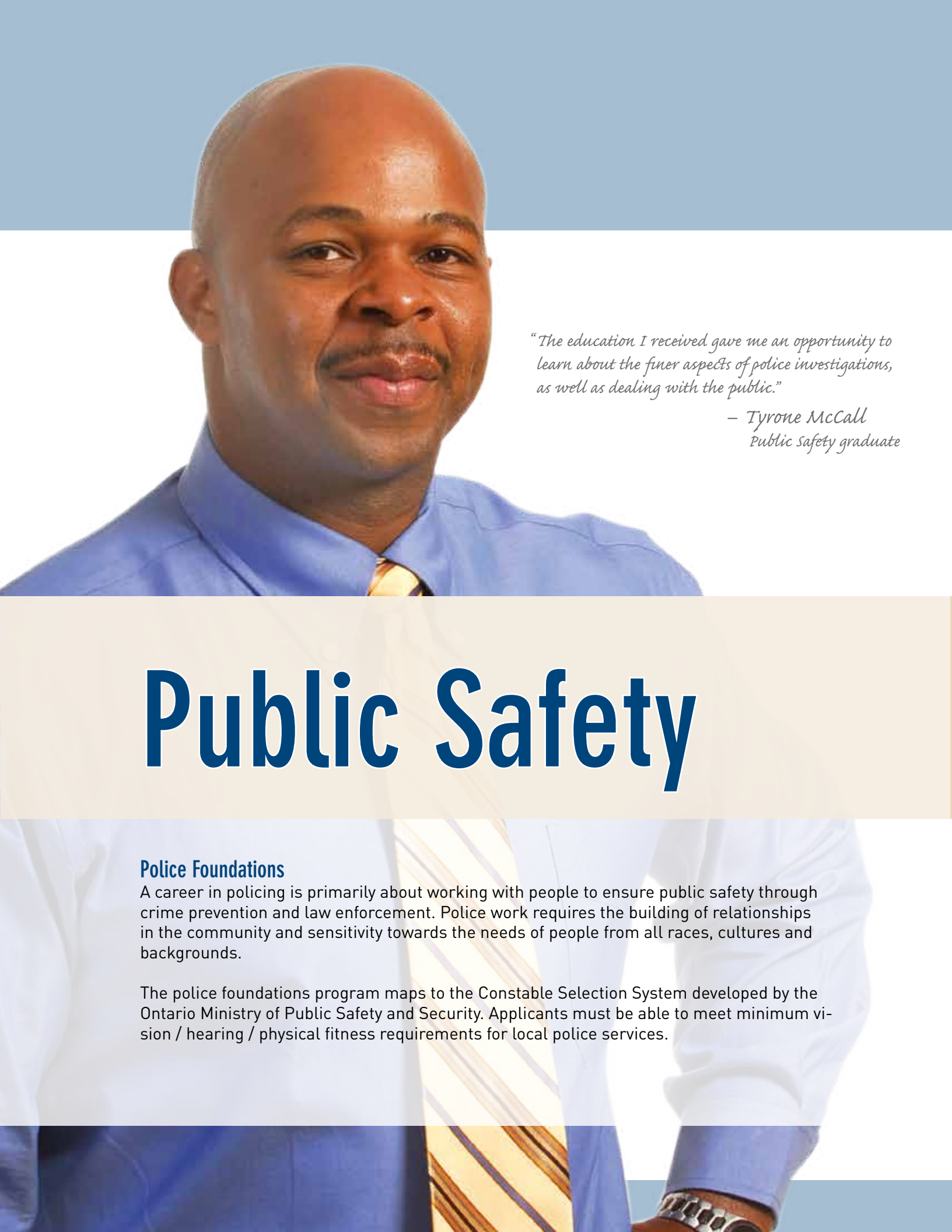
Upon graduation, you may work with photographers, illustrators, typographers, printers, programmers, and fabricators in a range of industries, including advertising firms, commercial printing firms, and publishing companies. Some common job titles include advertising designer, graphic artist, and layout/page designer, to name a few.

Web Site Design/Web Development

Web site designers work with specialized Web languages such as HTML and JavaScript®; Web graphic applications such as PhotoShop®, Flash®, and Fireworks®; and Web authoring tools such as FrontPage® and Dreamweaver®. Web site designers work in any organization that has client-side Web applications, such as IT companies, businesses, or government agencies. Many Web designers offer their services as freelancers to a variety of organizations spanning a multitude of industries. Possible job positions include Web designer and client-side Web site developer.

Interior Design

Interior designers conceptualize and produce aesthetic, functional and safe designs for interior spaces in residential, commercial, cultural, institutional and industrial buildings. They are employed by architectural firms, interior design firms, retail establishments, construction companies, hospitals, airlines, hotel and restaurant chains, and other establishments or they may be self-employed.

Public Safety

Police Foundations

A career in policing is primarily about working with people to ensure public safety through crime prevention and law enforcement. Police work requires the building of relationships in the community and sensitivity towards the needs of people from all races, cultures and backgrounds.

The police foundations program maps to the Constable Selection System developed by the Ontario Ministry of Public Safety and Security. Applicants must be able to meet minimum vision / hearing / physical fitness requirements for local police services.

Industry Stamp of Approval

Herzing Colleges are licensed by the appropriate provincial authorities.

Herzing College seeks to gain industry approval by injecting certification preparation into many of our programs. Our graduates often complete rigorous independent testing that results in industry-recognized specialization from organizations like Microsoft®, CompTia®, and Oracle®, to name a few.

Some companies utilize industry certifications to provide a third-party basis to ensure that a job applicant has a certain skill/knowledge base. This saves the employer the time of doing independent technical testing or appraising the curriculum taken by the student.

With industry certifications, there is some employer concern about a “paper” certification. This type of certification is generally given to a person taking a crash course where the only focus is to pass a certification exam. With these short programs, there is often insufficient lab and instructional time to train the student to actually do the work. At Herzing, we provide much more time in certification subjects within our academic programs than is typically provided in short-term courses.

Financial Aid Services

Herzing College will help students develop financial plans to pay for their education through a combination of financial aid, family contributions, and employer tuition reimbursement plans.

A variety of methods of meeting educational expenses is available at each campus. Financial aid (if you qualify), including Provincial student assistance programs, bur-

saries, and Canada Student Loans*, may be arranged to assist with the cost of tuition, school supplies, living expenses, and transportation. These different types of aid are usually combined in a "package" that can make it easier to achieve your career goals.

Service Quality Assurance

This assurance is aimed at satisfying the needs of students and their eventual employers. It states that a Herzing College student may retake any course with which he or she is dissatisfied at no additional charge for tuition. Herzing College will allow any graduate to retake a course if an employer feels that he or she is not functioning satisfactorily in a job related to his or her program of study. The graduate will be allowed to retake any course offered in the student's completed curriculum without tuition cost to the student or the employer. Students must complete and pass the course and meet other conditions.
